How to get there:

FROM MIAMI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT Exit the Airport onto LeJeune Road South (Exit 4). Continue south for another 5 miles to Bird Road (SW 40th Street). Make a left and proceed 1 mile to S.W. 27th Avenue. Make a right and proceed one light to Tigertail Avenue. Continue 1/2 block. The Hotel will be on your right.

PARKING Valet parking only

FROM I 95 NORTH Proceed on 95 (I-95) south until it becomes US 1. I-95 will merge onto South Dixie Hwy (US 1) Continue south 3 miles to S.W. 27th Avenue. Make a left and proceed past two traffic lights to Tigertail Avenue. Continue 1/2 block. The hotel will be on your right. **FROM SOUTH**

DIXIE HWY (US 1) Proceed North on US 1 to Bird Road (S.W. 40th Street). Make a right and continue on Bird Road to S.W. 27th Avenue and continue two lights to Tigertail Avenue. Continue 1/2 block. The hotel will be on your right.

FROM FORT LAUDERDALE AIRPORT Take SR-848 West Merge onto SR-9 Take I-95 South Proceed on I-95 south until it becomes US 1. I-95 will merge onto South Dixie Hwy (US 1) Continue south 3 miles to S.W. 27th Avenue. Make a left and proceed past two traffic lights to Tigertail Avenue. Continue 1/2 block. The hotel will be on your right.

Coconut Grove

The Grove - South Florida's first bayside community is located just south of downtown Miami. It's an eclectic village made up of funky cafes, incredible shopping, exciting nightlife, and great annual festivals and cultural activities. Find everything you are looking for in Coconut

In the 1950's, artists from all over the US and as far away as Europe, settled in Coconut Grove and established studios. The Grove soon became known as an artists colony, and it was not unusual to see artists setting up their easels on the sidewalks and painting the local scene. By the 1960's there were many thriving art galleries as well as Grove House, an artists' co-op. In 1963, the Coconut Grove Arts Festival, now recognized as one of the leading arts festivals in the country, was established. From funkadelic to art deco, the Grove offers village nightlife just out the door of the Ritz-Carlton.
